Dear Ms. Dortch:

This will report on telephone calls, discussing the ISBA/MMTC/OC, Inc. Petition for Immediate Relief ("Petition"), and placed to me by: (1) Chairman Kevin Martin and Michelle Carey, Legal Assistant to Chairman Martin (5/30/07) and Rick Chessen, Legal Assistant to Commissioner Copps (5/30/07). On each call, I made these points:

- as the experience with Hurricane Katrina demonstrated, emergency messages and in-depth emergency information need to be provided to significant language groups in their own languages by speakers who can provide context, reassurance and trustworthy information
- there is a place in EAS planning for translations, but primary reliance in an emergency should be placed on in-language, broadcast radio communication in the human voice, in light of the desperate state of many listeners and their exclusive reliance on over the air radio if telephone and electric services are disrupted
- despite two years of Commission encouragement of voluntary initiatives, only ISBA and the Florida Association of Broadcasters have taken concrete steps to ensure that a "designated hitter" English language station will provide emergency information in Spanish (or other languages) when no Spanish (or other language) station is operational
- the Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau should call in all stakeholders for consultations before the Commission votes on the Petition.
- MMTC would be agreeable to the issuance of a further NPRM to update the record on an expedited basis.
