WITHDRAW

The Hispanic Information and Telecommunications Network, Inc. (“HITN”), by its attorneys, hereby withdraws its Petition to Deny¹ of the Application for Authority to Transfer Control from News Corporation and DirecTV Group, Inc. to Liberty Media Corporation in the above referenced proceeding.²

We respectfully encourage the Federal Communications Commission to address important issues raised in our original filing related to the carriage of public interest, minority controlled, and independent channels in a broader proceeding. HITN’s Petition for Declaratory

Ruling filed on May 18, 2007 raises one such critical issue regarding qualifications for carriage on the public interest set aside channels. HITN has requested that the Commission open that proceeding for public comments so that interested parties may participate regarding whether V-Me Media, Inc. is qualified to be carried as a public interest programmer on DBS.
