Dear Ms. Dortch:

On 6 June 2007, Neeraj Srivastava and Kerry Murray of Dell, along with Ed Thomas of this office, met with Julius Knapp, Allen Stillwell, Ronald Rapasi and Ira Keltz of the Office of Engineering and Technology. During this meeting, the above-captioned proceeding was briefly discussed and Mr. Srivastava made the following points:

- All the available technical information makes it clear that personal and portable white space devices can operate without causing interference to broadcasters or wireless microphones
- Dell is so convinced that white space devices and DTV can co-exist that it believes computer manufacturers may well put ATSC tuners, and white space chipsets, in the same devices.
- Dell believes that the potential market for white space devices is enormous, and that it is entirely possible that virtually every computer sold (about 257 million were sold last year) could have a white space device incorporated in it.
