As a teacher, I believe no child should be left behind because existing broadband options are not affordable. Passage of Docket No. 07-16 would make broadband fast and free to the majority of Americans.

According to Pew Internet Report, at least 79 percent of college students rely on the Internet. At Apex Language Center, we teach English, Spanish, Polish, Hebrew, Russian, Italian, French and Latin. Our students rely on our website for the latest class offerings and registration.

If a student's only access to high speed Internet is at school, it will greatly limit their participation in on-line study groups, research and their ability to do homework.

Currently, the U.S. is ranked behind Estonia in terms of it's broadband penetration. That is not acceptable. The M2Z proposal would make the U.S. a leader in broadband penetration. Please support Docket No. 07-16.
