I fully support the proposed Sirius / XM merger. I definitely believe that satellite radio does compete against all forms of other radio including terrestrial, internet, and, especially ipods. I live in New York City area where I can only pick one cable provider based on where I live. It is either Cablevision, Time Warner, or Comcast that services my area. I don't have the ability to pick my provider from all three BUT I can pick from choosing only broadcast, satellite tv, or cable AND if I pick cable, I can pick what channels or package that I want and pay accordingly to what I want or what I can afford. I like the aspect of a la carte pricing and feel that this would give me the same options as cable without feeling that it is violating any anti-trust rules. I have Sirius right now but wish I had access to XM Satellite radio as well. I definitely can't afford to buy two radios and pay for both services but will sign up immediately for a revised plan if I had access to both sets of stations. I don't feel the NAB has the consumers' best interest in this debate. Once again, I fully support the proposed merger between Sirius / XM.
