
Dear Secretary Dortch:

On July 6, 2007, the undersigned, together with Christopher L. Ottele of Holme Roberts & Owen LLP, talked by telephone with Royce Sherlock, Tracy Waldon, and William Beckwith of the Media Bureau to further the manner in which Liberty Global, Inc. ("LGI") should respond to the Information and Document Request (the "Request") issued to LGI in the above-referenced proceeding.

In addition to guidance Staff previously provided at our July 2, 2007 meeting, Staff agreed that the list of proposed custodians LGI proffered at that meeting would be acceptable for the required document production. LGI explained that any communications between Liberty Cablevision of Puerto Rico, Ltd. and the officers or directors of LGI relating to the subject matters of the Request would be in the files of such custodians if they exist at all, and Staff and LGI agreed that any such documents, if they exist, would be deemed "responsive" and provided by LGI in response to the Request. Finally, Staff agreed that, given the extremely broad document collection that LGI's attorneys already have performed with respect to the identified custodians, those collected documents could be used as the appropriate universe for responding to the Request, without the need for renewed collection.
