Dear Ms. Dortch:

The Coalition for 4G in America has expressed its support for the adoption of Band Plan Proposal Number 3 (“Band Plan 3”), as well as for taking actions consistent with the other 4G Coalition principles, specifically providing for an 11 MHz paired block licensed in REAGs, with limited combinatorial bidding.¹ On July 6, 2007, in a meeting that included leaders from the public safety community, Access Spectrum and Pegasus Communications recommended that the Commission consider an alternative band plan for the Upper 700 MHz spectrum (“Band Plan 3.1”) should the Commission not adopt Band Plan 3.² If the Commission were to impose conditions on the 5 MHz commercial block closest to the public safety broadband block (the D Block in Band Plan 3), designed to create a public-private partnership, the Coalition for 4G in America would support the adoption of Band Plan 3.1. If the Commission does not adopt public-private partnership conditions for the D Block, the Coalition for 4G in America continues to believe that the A block should remain adjacent to the public safety spectrum.
