Dear Ms. Dortch:

On behalf of OutQ, the undersigned parties express their strong support for the proposed merger of Sirius Satellite Radio ("Sirius") and XM Radio Inc. ("XM").

OutQ, which is carried on Sirius Channel 109, launched in 2003 as radio's first national all-gay radio station. Today, OutQ provides listeners with a wide variety of news, information, and entertainment for the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgendered community. Although OutQ is not the only audio outlet dedicated to a gay audience, we believe that our channel offers a unique and innovative brand of radio. Most importantly, OutQ provides an unmatched outlet for people to hear and speak honestly and openly about gay issues.

The producers, hosts and staff of OutQ believe that a merger with XM will have many important benefits. In particular, the merger will broaden the accessibility of the distinctive and valuable material offered via OutQ. Moreover, listeners with an interest in gay-oriented programming no longer will have to choose between receiving OutQ and other channels now carried exclusively on XM that also may appeal to them.

For these reasons, we urge the FCC to approve this merger as quickly as possible.
