
This letter is to report permitted, oral *ex parte* communications of Frontline Wireless, LLC (“Frontline”) and its counsel concerning the above-referenced proceedings.

On July 18, 2007, Mark Fowler, Janice Obuchowski, Haynes Griffin and Gerard Waldron met with Commissioner Jonathan S. Adelstein, and Barry Ohlson and Renee Crittendon from his staff. In a separate conversation, Reed Hundt also spoke with Commissioner Adelstein. The parties discussed the need for a no-retail condition to be combined with open access rules on the “C Block” in order to achieve the goals that the open access condition would be intended to promote. With regard to the “D Block,” the parties spoke about public safety’s need for a 4G network reaching 99% of the population. Finally, the parties discussed the importance of making the small business bidding credit available to all qualified bidders.

Finally, also on July 18, Jonathan Blake spoke with Sam Feder, the Commission’s General Counsel. Mr. Blake raised questions about the legality of the National Public Safety Licensee’s proposed “veto” on the D Block license.
