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Dear Ms. Dortch:

Cox Communications, Inc. (“Cox”), by its attorneys, hereby consents to public disclosure of certain information identified as confidential in the Commission’s *Memorandum Opinion and Order*, released December 2, 2005, in the above-referenced proceeding.<sup>1</sup> Specifically, Cox waives any claim to confidentiality and authorizes disclosure of all information contained in:

- 1) the first citation following the second sentence of footnote 155;
- 2) the second sentence of paragraph 62;
- 3) the first and second sentences of paragraph 69; and
- 4) the third sentence of footnote 187.

This waiver is limited to the information contained in the identified passages of the *Memorandum Opinion and Order* and is further limited to the Commission’s identification of the wire center coverage threshold used to identify wire centers where forbearance. This waiver does not extend to any underlying data provided by Cox related to the Commission’s determination of the appropriate threshold in the Omaha MSA. Cox also explicitly does not waive confidential treatment for any of the information it submitted to the Commission pursuant to the Protective Order entered in this docket, except to the limited extent outlined herein.
