Re: WC Docket No. 07-156, Comp. Pol. File No. 812 – In the Matter of Application of Pac-West Telecomm, Inc. to Discontinue Domestic Telecommunications Services

Dear Ms. Dortch:

Yesterday, representatives of Dollar Phone Corp. (“Dollar Phone”) met with Commission staff to discuss the Section 63.71 Application filed by Pac-West Telecomm, Inc. (“Pac-West) in the above-referenced docket.¹ Peter Rohrbach of Hogan & Hartson and I participated in the meeting in person on behalf of Dollar Phone, and Asher Gluck, Director of Network Operations for Dollar Phone, participated via teleconference. John Adams, Neil Dellar, Rodney McDonald, and Jeremy Miller participated on behalf of the Commission.

The issues discussed and the views expressed by Dollar Phone at the meeting were consistent with the company’s earlier-filed submissions in this docket.² Dollar Phone also updated the Commission on its work to transition off the Eastern Network without adverse impact on pre-paid card consumers. Dollar Phone explained that it is working with carriers who


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are actively establishing replacement network facilities. Dollar Phone indicated that, as of now, it expects this transition to be completed between August 30 and September 15, preferably on the earlier side of that window. However, Dollar Phone made clear that this schedule is not within its control, and that the August 30 date is the best possible case, assuming no further problems or delays in the provisioning process such as those Dollar Phone already has experienced in one instance. Dollar Phone believes it is much more likely that the work will run into the month of September.

In these circumstances, Dollar Phone asked the Commission to require Pac-West to continue to operate the affected markets until September 15, subject to a condition that Pac-West could discontinue service sooner if Dollar Phone and third party carriers complete the network transition earlier, but with an understanding that if unexpected problems prevent completion by September 15, the discontinuance would be delayed briefly accordingly. Dollar Phone offered to keep the Commission staff and Pac-West fully apprised of the progress of the transition as it continues to move forward. This schedule protects the interests of consumers who otherwise will suffer service and financial losses for the reasons explained in Dollar Phone's previous submissions in this proceeding.
