Dear Ms. Dortch,

On August 29, 2007, on behalf of AT&T, Inc., Robert W. Quinn, Senior Vice President Federal Regulatory and Brian Fontes, Vice President Federal Relations, met with Federal Communications Commissioner Jonathan S. Adelstein and Scott Bergman, Legal Advisor for Wireline Issues, to discuss two issues: Wireless E-911 and forbearance of certain dominant carrier regulations for in-region, interstate interexchange services.

AT&T addressed the importance of E-911 and its commitment to the provisioning of E-911 services. AT&T expressed concern about the potential enforcement date regarding wireless E-911 accuracy at the PSAP level. AT&T recommends that carriers be permitted to file compliance plans with benchmarks as an effective means to ensure compliance with new FCC wireless E-911 rules.

In addition, we briefly discussed the status of the Commission's Section 272 Sunset proceeding and AT&T's petition for forbearance from certain dominant carrier regulations for its in-region, interstate interexchange services. AT&T's discussions here were consistent with its filed comments in these proceedings.
