Dear Ms. Dortch:

Pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Commission's rules, BT hereby gives notice that on September 4, 2007, Aryeh Friedman and Sheba Chacko met with Commissioner Adelstein and his Legal Advisor Scott Bergmann to discuss:

1. the implications of granting Qwest's Petition for Forbearance from Title II and Computer inquiry rules with respect to broadband services on the Special Access Proceeding;
2. the overwhelming evidence in the record of market failure for special access services purchased at retail primarily by large business ("enterprise") customers and at wholesale by carriers serving those enterprise customers, including (i) the lack of intra- or inter- modal competition in that market and the finding of that effect by the DoJ after reviewing the networks of *all* providers; and (ii) the evidence of substantially above cost (LRIC) pricing and extraordinary rates of return; and
3. in light of this market failure the relative costs of leaving things as they are as compared to adopting a proportional regulatory response, including the benefits of market-driven rather than BOC-determined innovation and the experience of other countries who have adopted such proportional regulatory responses after realizing the harm caused by premature deregulation.
