RE: 81555 filer Wavier Request Late Fee Chg.

On April 10, 2007, N R Recording & Communications Inc.(Company) received by US mail its 499-A packet from USAC. I immediately called USAC and advised them that I had just received the 499-A packet which normally is received by mid March. I spoke with Mr. Fiscus of USAC and he advised me that the FCC was late approving the Form 499-A and that USAC was unable to mail the packet out timely. I told Mr. Fiscus that the packet is due on April 1, 2007 and to receive it on April 10, 2007 doesn't make sense and he agreed and he stated that it was foolish to mail the packet without USAC extending the due date. Mr. Fiscus issued me a USAC reference number of PM172725 during my conversation with him. Mr. Fiscus made no mention that the packet might be available on the USAC web site.

Internet service is available in Great Falls but not without problems, coverage and high cost. Wireline service is slow and if equipment isn't maintained service becomes questionable. For example, a year ago our City Government experienced dramatic problems with their provider, the system was down for an extended period of time. Other providers have switched from offering wireless to wireline. At present cost, reliability and security are the main factors of not transacting business on the Internet. There is nothing worse than to subscribe with a provider and experience marginal to poor service and eventually it becomes necessary to switch to another provider which in turn requires the changing of an Internet address and notifying clients of the change. These actions paint an image of un-professionalism it is costly, inconvenient and a burden and than there are the security issues.

Three occasions I visited with a Mr. Fred Theobald of USAC about the late arrival of the Form 499-A. He confirmed that the form was late being approved by the FCC and that USAC was unable to get a quick turn around from the printer and that the form did not get mailed until April 1, 2007, which is the due date of the Form 499-A. He said other companies have been calling regarding this issue and that there is nothing he could do, it's an FCC problem. There again there was no mention that the Form 499-A could have been found on the USAC web site.

Three weeks ago, the Company received a bill from Welch & Co. for \$125.00 the \$25.00 was for the annual share cost of the NANP and the \$100.00 was a late filing fee charge. I visited with a Ms. Canniff of the Welch & Co. she advised me that they take their data from USAC and that Welch & Company cannot change charges, that only USAC can. She was aware of the situation with the Form 499-A. I mentioned the language on the Form 499-A states a late fee charge of .005% would be imposed if the Form 499-A was received late by USAC nothing on the Form 499-A addressed a \$100.00 late fee charge.


Last week we received a bill from USAC for \$100.00 which represented a late filing fee charge connected with the Form 499-A. Here again USAC is not following the charges spelled out on the Form 499-A for late filing fee charges.

I feel that NR Recording & Communications Inc. and other wireless carriers are being treated unfairly with this issue by USAC. If in turn, the Form 499-A wasn't approved by the FCC until March 19, 2007. By the time USAC had the packet and if they put it on the USAC web site, it still would not allow adequate turn around time if the form was being mailed back to USAC by US mail which provides proof of mailing.

In conclusion, I feel that NR Recording & Communications Inc. performed in a professional manner on this issue and that the Company took all steps that it thought were proper to avoid a late filing of the Form 499-A. In checking, the US mail is still the only dependable legal proof provider of mailings and NR Recording & Communications Inc. totally relies on US mail. Internet services do not provide a guarantee of mailing or is it security safe.

The FCC is now addressing taking more stringent steps on "faxes" and it's questionable secured environment. The same may soon pertain to Internet.

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

I am enclosing a company check in the amount of \$100.00 which represents a late fee charge on the filing of the Form 499-A which was late being mailed by USAC.


I stated NR Recording and Communications Inc. (Company) does not have Internet service. After having three conversations on the phone regarding the late mailing of the Form 499-A by USAC to the carriers, internet service does not legally replace US mail and we depend 100% on the US mail service.

I addressed that on the Form 499-A cover instruction sheet or the Form 499-A does not address a \$100.00 late fee. The only late fee addressed is .005% of revenue.

Under the facts that I have and the information about the late mailing of the Form 499-A by USAC this company is paying the late filing fee " UNDER PROTEST ". If USAC is found incorrect in imposing the late fee, we are requesting our \$100.00 to be mailed back to us along with a letter of an apology within 15 days of the ruling. We have a right to impose an interest rate charge on this payment along with any costs that have been incurred by the company. If the company desires to expense, these items, it will be handled by a separate billing.

This company has a reference # issued by USAC of PM172725 pertaining to this issue. If you have any questions, I'll be more than happy to entertain you.
