Martin, his Chief of Staff, Daniel Gonzalez, his Legal Advisor, Erika Olsen, and Aaron Goldberger. William S. Beans, Jr., Chairman and CEO of Open Range Communications, Inc. (“Open Range”), Joe D. Among other issues, Globalstar presented its views in the above-referenced proceedings, consistent with its prior filings with the Commission. In addition, Open Range described the potential to use MSS/ATC for affordable, high speed broadband service in rural areas.
