Dear Ms. Dortch:

On September 18, 2007, Harold Feld of the Media Access Project met with Chairman Martin with regard to the above captioned matter.

Mr. Feld, observed that NAF, in collaboration with the University of Kansas, had submitted independent sensing data. NAF and the University of Kansas believe that further research conducted over the next two months will provide additional information and rebut allegations by NAB and others that the failure of the Microsoft prototype demonstrates that unlicensed devices cannot operate in the white spaces without causing harmful interference to incumbents. Accordingly, NAF, *et al.*, ask that the Commission delay action on a final Order until December 2007 or January 2008 to allow NAF, *et al.*, to complete its studies and to provide sufficient time for OET to verify the results.

Mr. Feld, urged that the Commission should not attempt to decide on standards for fixed unlicensed use and defer rules for mobile use to a further rulemaking. Because the standards for fixed and mobile will inform one another, it makes no sense to address them in separate proceedings.

In accordance with Section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's Rules, 47 CFR §1.1206, this letter is being filed with your office.
