Dear Ms. Dortch:

On September 24, 2007, Sara Leibman and Amy Wolverton of T-Mobile USA, Inc. (“T-Mobile”) met with Scott Deutchman of Commissioner Copps’ office to discuss issues arising in the above-referenced proceedings.

During our meeting, we reiterated T-Mobile’s support for CTIA’s Petition for Declaratory Ruling on Universal Service Contribution Obligations as consistent with our previous comments and ex partes. In particular, we explained that prompt Commission action on CTIA’s Petition would remove the substantial uncertainty many wireless carriers currently face regarding appropriate method of allocating toll revenues for Universal Service contribution purposes.

We also briefly discussed T-Mobile’s pending Petition for Declaratory Ruling, filed jointly with Sprint Nextel Corporation, requesting that all carriers obligated to provide number portability may not obstruct or delay the porting process by demanding from the porting-in carrier information in excess of the minimum information needed to validate the requesting customer. We emphasized that simple number porting rules and processes would maximize consumer choice and foster industry competition.

One electronic copy of this ex parte notice is being submitted to the Secretary of the FCC in accordance with Section 1.1206 of the Commission’s rules.
