On behalf of the State of New Hampshire (the State), the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission hereby submits the State's application to renew its telecommunications relay service (TRS) certification for the five year period beginning July 1, 2008 and ending June 30, 2013.

Pursuant to 47 C.F.R. Section 64.604, Mandatory Minimum Standards, this application establishes that the State of New Hampshire's TRS program meets all operational, technical, and functional minimum standards, and also establishes, where those standards are exceeded, that the State's program in no way conflicts with federal law.

The State of New Hampshire certifies that it has complied, and will continue to comply, with the provisions of Title IV of the Americans with Disabilities Act, Telecommunications for Hearing Impaired and Speech Impaired Individuals, and has overseen, and will continue to oversee, Sprint Relay, the State's TRS provider, to ensure that all requirements are met.
