**APPLICATION FOR CONSENT TO TRANSFER OF CONTROL OF  
DOMESTIC BLANKET SECTION 214 AUTHORIZATIONS**

The Shareholders of Bayland Telephone, Inc. ("Transferors"; FRN: 0016974198) and Northeast Communications of Wisconsin, Inc., d/b/a Nsight Telservices ("Nsight" or "Transferee"; FRN: 0002706190) hereby request Commission authorization for the transfer of control of Bayland Telephone, Inc. ("Bayland"; FRN: 0003749736) and the blanket domestic Section 214 authorizations held by Bayland and its wholly-owned subsidiaries Bayland Communications, Inc. ("BCI"; FRN: 0003749744) and Baynet, Inc. ("Baynet"; FRN: 0003749751) from the current shareholders of Bayland to Nsight.

Bayland, a Wisconsin corporation, provides local exchange telephone services (including interstate exchange access) as an incumbent local exchange carrier ("ILEC") to a single exchange (approximately 2,350 access lines) in and around the community of Abrams (2000 population: 1,757) in Oconto County in rural northeastern Wisconsin.

Bayland's subsidiary BCI, a Wisconsin corporation, provides local exchange telephone services (including interstate exchange access) to approximately 2,100 access lines as a competitive local exchange carrier ("CLEC") in competition with CenturyTel in and around the communities of Oconto (2000 population: 4,708) and Oconto Falls (2000 population: 2,843) in Oconto County, Wisconsin; as well as in and around the communities of Marinette (2000 population: 11,009) and Peshtigo (2000 population: 3,819) in Marinette County in rural northeastern Wisconsin. Bayland's subsidiary Baynet, a Wisconsin corporation, provides resold interstate toll services to customers located in and around the Bayland and BCI local exchange service areas in the Abrams, Oconto, Oconto Falls, Marinette and Peshtigo areas.

Nsight, a Wisconsin corporation, holds seventeen Local Multipoint Distribution Service ("LMDS") station licenses (Stations WPLM487, WPLM488, WPLM489, WPLM490, WPLM491, WPLM492, WPLM493, WPLM494, WPLM495, WPLM496, WPLM497, WPLM498, WPLM499, WPLM500, WPLM501, WPLM502 and WPLM503) in its own name. It is the parent company, *inter alia*, of: (1) Northeast Telephone Company, LLC ("NET"), a Wisconsin limited liability corporation, which provides local exchange telephone services (including interstate exchange access) as an ILEC to four exchanges (approximately 8,718 access lines) in and around the communities of Pulaski (2000 population: 3,060), Oneida (2000 population: 4,001) and Mill Center (2000 population: 110) in Brown County, Wisconsin; and Krakow (2000 population: 370) in Shawano County, Wisconsin; and (2) NET LEC, LLC, a Wisconsin limited liability company, which provides resold long distance, competitive local exchange and Internet access services in and around the cities of Green Bay, Appleton,

Wausau, and Stevens Point in northeastern Wisconsin, and Iron Mountain in northern Michigan.

Bayland presently has issued and outstanding 4,563 shares of common stock (its only class of stock) that are owned by twenty-seven (27) shareholders. Bayland currently has five (5) shareholders that own 10.00 percent or more of its common stock, with the largest shareholder owning a 15.01 percent interest.

The proposed transaction will be accomplished by the merger of Bayland Acquisition, Inc. ("BAI"), a newly-formed Wisconsin corporation owned 100 percent by Nsight, with and into Bayland, with Bayland continuing as the surviving corporation. The pre-merger shares and rights of Bayland will be cancelled and extinguished, subject to various provisions for the payment of the merger consideration to consenting shareholders and dissenting shareholders. At the completion of the various merger procedures, all of the issued and outstanding common stock of Bayland will be owned by Nsight. Control of Bayland will give Nsight control of the blanket domestic Section 214 authorizations of Bayland and its wholly-owned subsidiaries BCI and Baynet.

Bayland and Nsight hereby certify, pursuant to 47 C.F.R. §§1.2001 through 1.2003, that no party to the present application is subject to denial of Federal benefits pursuant to section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.

- (6) Description of the transaction:**

The proposed transaction entails the transfer of control of Bayland and its subsidiaries BCI and Baynet from Bayland's existing 27 shareholders to Nsight. The transaction will be accomplished by the merger of Bayland Acquisition, Inc. ("BAI"), a newly-formed Wisconsin corporation owned 100 percent by Nsight, with and into Bayland, with Bayland continuing as the surviving corporation. The pre-merger shares and rights of Bayland will be cancelled and extinguished, subject to various provisions for the payment of the merger consideration to consenting shareholders and dissenting shareholders. When the various merger procedures are completed, all of the issued and outstanding common stock of Bayland will be owned by Nsight. Control of Bayland will give Nsight control of the blanket domestic Section 214 authorizations held by Bayland and its wholly-owned subsidiaries BCI and Baynet.

- (7) Description of the geographic areas in which the transferor and transferee (and their affiliates) offer domestic telecommunications services, and what services are provided in each area:**

A map showing the Wisconsin local exchange service areas of Bayland (#6) and Nsight's existing subsidiary NET (#51) is attached. The Bayland and NET local exchange service areas are adjacent to each other.

**Areas and Services of Bayland and affiliates**

Bayland provides local exchange telephone services (including interstate exchange access) as an ILEC within a single exchange (approximately 2,350 access lines) in and around the community of Abrams in Oconto County in rural northeastern Wisconsin. Bayland offers custom calling features and adjunct local services such as call waiting, call forwarding, caller ID, and voice mail.

Bayland also provides cable television services, and dial-up and high speed Internet access services, in and around Abrams and Little Suamico, Wisconsin.

Bayland serves as an authorized agent for Nsight's affiliated wireless services in Wisconsin RSA #4B.

Bayland presently serves as an authorized agent of TDS Metrocom to provide business telephone and Internet access services in Green Bay and the Fox Cities area (the cities of Appleton, Kaukauna, Menasha and Neenah; the towns of Buchanan, Clayton, Grand Chute, Greenville, Harrison, Kaukauna, Menasha, Neenah and Vandebroek, and the villages of Combined Locks, Hortonville, Kimberly, Little Chute and Sherwood) in northeastern Wisconsin. After the completion of the proposed transaction, it is the understanding of Bayland and Nsight that TDS Metrocom will continue to provide telephone and Internet access services in Green Bay and the Fox Cities area either directly or through other agents.

Bayland's wholly-owned subsidiary BCI provides competitive local exchange services (including interstate exchange access, custom calling features and adjunct services) in competition with CenturyTel in and around the Oconto County, Wisconsin communities of Oconto and Oconto Falls, and the Marinette County, Wisconsin communities of Marinette and Peshtigo. BCI also provides dial-up and high-speed Internet access services in Oconto and Oconto Falls. In the aggregate, BCI's CLEC operations serve approximately 2,100 access lines.

Bayland's wholly-owned subsidiary Baynet resells interstate, intrastate and international long distance toll services in and around the Abrams, Oconto, Oconto Falls, Marinette and Peshtigo local exchange service areas of Bayland and BCI.

Bayland and its subsidiaries and affiliates have no ownership interests in any other entities that offer domestic telecommunications services.

#### **Areas and Services of Nsight and Affiliates**

Nsight is predominately a holding company. However, it is also the current owner of seventeen Local Multipoint Distribution Service ("LMDS") licenses (Stations WPLM487, WPLM488, WPLM489, WPLM490, WPLM491, WPLM492, WPLM493, WPLM494, WPLM495, WPLM496, WPLM497, WPLM498, WPLM499, WPLM500, WPLM501, WPLM502 and WPLM503) for market areas in Wisconsin, Michigan and California

Nsight's wholly-owned subsidiary NET provides local exchange telephone services (including interstate exchange access) as an ILEC to four exchanges (approximately 8,718 access lines) in and around the northeastern Wisconsin communities of Pulaski, Oneida and Mill Center in Brown County, and Krakow in Shawano County. It has deployed a fiber optic network throughout its service area, and offers custom calling features, digital trunking, and digital subscriber line ("DSL") services.

Nsight's wholly-owned subsidiary NET LEC, LLC ("NET LEC") provides resold long distance, competitive local exchange and Internet access services in and around Green Bay, Appleton, Wausau and Stevens Point, Wisconsin, and Iron Mountain, Michigan. NET LEC owns and manages fiber optic routes from Green Bay to Iron Mountain, and from Green Bay to Wausau and Merrill, Wisconsin. NET LEC also provides cable television services in the Green Bay area.

Nsight's wholly-owned subsidiary New-Cell, Inc., a Wisconsin corporation, provides telecommunications management services in various Wisconsin markets.

Nsight's wholly-owned subsidiary Brown County CLEC, LLC, a Wisconsin limited liability company, provides competitive local exchange services via fiber optic rings in the Green Bay and Appleton, Wisconsin areas.

Nsight is the controlling interest holder in Brown County MSA Cellular Limited Partnership, which is the licensee of cellular station KNKA547 and related point-to-point microwave stations that provide cellular service in Cellular Market Area 186B.

Nsight owns a 100.00 percent member interest in Nsighttel Wireless, LLC, a Wisconsin limited liability company which is the licensee of the following Personal Communications Service ("PCS") serving portions of Wisconsin, Michigan, Minnesota and Iowa: KNLF931-Appleton-Oshkosh, WI (BTA018F); KNLG938-Fond du Lac, WI (BTA148F); KNLG939-Iron Mountain, MI (BTA206F); KNLG940-Ironwood, MI (BTA207F); KNLG941-Manitowoc, WI (BTA276F); KNLG942-Sheboygan, WI (BTA417F); KNLG943-Wausau-Rhineland, WI (BTA466F); KNLF999-Green Bay, WI (BTA173F); KNLH353-Stevens Point, WI (BTA432F); WPOJ777-Escanaba, MI (BTA132C); WPOJ778-Houghton, MI (BTA194C); WPOJ779-Marquette, MI (BTA282C); WPOJ780-Petosky, MI (BTA345C2); WPOJ781-Traverse City, MI (BTA446C2); KNLG972-Escanaba, MI (BTA132E); WQCS451-Houghton, MI (BTA194E); WQCS452-Iron Mountain, MI (BTA206E); WQCS453-Ironwood, MI (BTA207E); WQCS454-Marinette, WI-Menominee, MI (BTA279E); WQCS455-Sault Ste. Nsighttel is the licensee of the following AWS stations: WQGD648-Appleton-Oshkosh, WI (CMA125A); WQGD649-Sheboygan, WI (CMA277A); WQGD650-Northern Michigan, MI (BEA058C); WQGD651-Traverse City, MI (BEA061C); and WQGD652--La Crosse, WI-MN (BEA105C). These stations are not yet providing service to the public.

Nsight is the controlling interest holder in Wausau Cellular Telephone Company Limited Partnership, which is the licensee of cellular station KNKA619, and

associated point-to-point microwave stations that which provide cellular service in Cellular Market Area 263B.

Nsight owns non-controlling general and limited partner interests in Wisconsin RSA No. 4 Limited Partnership, which is the licensee of cellular station KNKN395 and associated point-to-point microwave stations that provide cellular service in Cellular Market Area 711B (Wisconsin RSA #4B). Transferors are also owners of non-controlling interests in Wisconsin RSA No. 4 Limited Partnership and a separate transfer of control application concerning those interests is being filed with the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau.

Nsight is the controlling interest holder in Wisconsin RSA-10 Limited Partnership which is the licensee of cellular station KNKN294 and associated point-to-point microwave stations that provide cellular service in Cellular Market Area 717B.

Nsight's wholly owned subsidiary Northeast Tower, LLC, is the licensee of Stations WNIP861 and WNKX830 which are authorized to provide interconnected business radio services in Marinette County, Wisconsin and Forest County, Wisconsin.

Nsight and its subsidiaries and affiliates have no ownership interests in any other entities that offer domestic telecommunications services.

**(8) Statement as to how the application fits into one or more of the presumptive streamlined categories in section 63.03 or why it is otherwise appropriate for streamlined treatment:**

Because the Bayland and NET exchange areas are adjacent to each other, the Application does not fit within the presumptive streamlined categories in Section 63.03(b) of the Commission's Rules, and streamlined treatment is not requested.

However, while not claiming streamlined treatment, the parties note that the proposed transaction will not have an adverse impact upon the Commission's competition and antitrust policies. Both before and after completion of the proposed transaction, Nsight and its affiliated companies will have a market share of less than ten percent (10.0%) of the interstate, interexchange market. Bayland and NET are incumbent independent local exchange carriers that have, in combination, far fewer than two percent (2.0%) of the nation's subscriber lines installed in the aggregate nationwide. Finally, Nsight will be taking control of the existing telephone exchange and exchange access services provided by Bayland, and has no affiliated telecommunications carrier that provides competitive local exchange services or exchange access services within Bayland's Abrams exchange, while Bayland's subsidiary BCI does not provide competitive local exchange services or exchange access services within NET's Pulaski, Oneida, Mill Center or Krakow exchanges.

**(9) Identification of all other Commission applications related to the same transaction:**

The Applicants will file an electronic application via the International Bureau Filing System for transfer of control of the International Section 214 authorization for global resale of switched services held by Baynet (File No. ITC-214-19970403-00193, granted May 23, 1997).

The Applicants will also file applications for FCC consent to the transfer of control of the following radio licenses: KNKN395, WPNG871, WPNG872, WPOS320, WPOS321, WQEZ478, WQEZ481, and WQEZ482.

**(10) Statement of whether the applicants are requesting special consideration because either party to the transaction is facing imminent business failure:**

No party to the transaction is facing imminent business failure at this time. Therefore, the applicants are not requesting special consideration because a party to the transaction is facing imminent business failure.

**(11) Identification of any separately filed waiver requests being sought in conjunction with the transaction:**

No separately filed waivers or waiver requests are being sought in conjunction with the proposed transaction.

**(12) Statement showing how grant of the application will serve the public interest, convenience and necessity, including any additional information that may be necessary to show the effect of the proposed transaction on competition in domestic markets:**

The proposed transaction entails the transfer of control of Bayland and its BCI and Baynet subsidiaries from Bayland's 27 existing shareholders to Nsight, an established rural telecommunications provider that has long served similar rural areas in northeastern Wisconsin. Bayland and Nsight both have proven records of investing in their rural networks and communities, and of providing high-quality, state-of-the-art voice, data and video services at affordable rates to their rural Wisconsin service areas. The proposed transaction will ensure that the rural Wisconsin customers of Bayland and its subsidiaries will continue to receive high-quality, state-of-the-art voice, data and video services at affordable rates for the foreseeable future.

Conclusion

In light of the foregoing facts and public interest considerations, the Commission is respectfully requested to authorize the transfer of control of the domestic blanket Section 214 authorizations held by Bayland and its BCI and Baynet subsidiaries to Nsight.

Bayland and Nsight reiterate that they certify, pursuant to 47 C.F.R. §§1.2001 through 1.2003, that no party to the present application is subject to denial of Federal benefits pursuant to section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.


