In review of the Commonwealth of Virginia Petition for Reconsideration, the State of Nebraska respectfully offers this letter of support. Nebraska has already submitted a waiver request regarding the matter of hardships that will be experienced by Nebraska public safety agencies that have made significant investment in equipment and planning.

Similar to the Commonwealth of Virginia, Nebraska public safety agencies are also concerned that the FCC Second Report and Order on 700 MHz rebanding will disrupt their implementation of public safety communications equipment at significant cost and hardship.

By offering support of Virginia's and Pierce County, Washington's Petitions for Reconsideration, Nebraska believes it highlights the similar nature and reliance on these 700 MHz implementations across the country.
