On October 15, 2007, the undersigned and Peter Corea, Senior Regulatory Counsel for ICO Global Communications (“ICO”), met with Julius Knapp, Chief of the Office of Engineering and Technology (OET); Geraldine Maise, Chief, OET Policy and Rules Division; Jamison Prime, OET; Patrick Forster, OET; and Nicholas Oros, OET; and Howard Griboff, Deputy Chief, Policy Division of the International Bureau. ICO addressed the “Joint Petition for Waiver of Sprint Nextel Corporation, the Association For Maximum Service Television, Inc. (MSTV), the National Association of Broadcasters (NAB), and the Society of Broadcast Engineers (SBE)” (“Joint Petition”), filed in the above-referenced proceedings on September 4, 2007.

Specifically, ICO reiterated statements in previous filings in the above-referenced dockets, noting that a grant of the Joint Petition would delay initiation of service on the 2 GHz mobile satellite service (MSS) systems. ICO also noted that ICO and TerreStar Networks, Inc. (“TerreStar”) are making efforts to devise a joint approach that would accommodate the requirements of the 2 GHz MSS licensees, Sprint Nextel, and the licensees of 2 GHz broadcast auxiliary service stations.
