
Dear Ms. Dortch:

This letter is to report permitted, oral *ex parte* communications of Frontline Wireless, LLC's ("Frontline's") counsel concerning the above-referenced proceedings.

On November 2, 2007, Jonathan Blake, Gerard Waldron and/or Matthew DelNero spoke with Aaron Goldberger, legal advisor to Chairman Kevin Martin, Fred Campbell, Chief of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, and Matthew Berry, Deputy General Counsel. One or more of them also spoke with John Branscome of the Office of Commissioner Michael J. Copps. Mr. Blake had separate conversations with Mr. Goldberger, Mr. Campbell and Renee Crittendon, legal advisor to Commissioner Jonathan Adelstein. Mr. Waldron also spoke with Ms. Crittendon on Friday and again on November 3. In these conversations, the parties discussed the need for prompt Commission action to ensure that facilities-based, wholesaling small businesses may receive a DE credit for bidding on the upper 700 MHz D Block. An immediate resolution of this issue is necessary to allow small businesses to raise the capital required to bid in the 700 MHz auction. In addition, the parties also spoke about the need for clarification as to the circumstances under which the default penalty would apply to the winning D Block bidder.
