**OPPOSITION TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION**

Alamo Public Telecommunications Council (“Alamo”), licensee of noncommercial educational television station KLRN, San Antonio, Texas (Facility ID 749), through its council, hereby opposes the Petition for Reconsideration of the Seventh Report and Order and Eighth Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the Matter of Advanced Television Systems and Their Impact upon the Existing Television Broadcast Service, MB Docket No. 87-268, FCC 07-138, 42 CR 1, released August 6, 2007 (the “Seventh Report and Order”), filed on October 2, 2007 by Corridor Television LLP (“Corridor”), licensee of television broadcast station KCWX, Fredericksburg, Texas (Facility ID 24316), seeking to change its tentative channel designation (“TCD”) for DTV operations, from channel 5 to channel 8. In support of this opposition, the following is set forth.

The Commission’s Seventh Report and Order fully considered Corridor’s request to change its tentative DTV channel designation from Channel 5 to Channel 8 and properly found that such proposal would cause impermissible interference to Stations KLRN and KTBC, Austin, Texas and declined to waive its interference limits. Corridor’s waiver request noted that there were numerous in-core UHF channels available to it which would result in no impermissible

interference to other stations. The only basis offered by Corridor for rejecting these UHF channels was that operating costs would be less for a VHF channel.

On October 2, 2007, Corridor filed a request to modify its request to change its tentative DTV channel designation from Channel 5 to Channel 8 by reducing power to 15 kW non-directional ERP at 413 meters HAAT. Corridor's modified request, on which its petition for reconsideration is now premised, would still cause impermissible interference to Stations KLRN and KTBC, requiring a waiver of the interference requirements, which the Commission's decision in the Seventh Report and Order found would be contrary to the public interest. Accordingly, there has been no change in circumstances which would require a different outcome on reconsideration.

Moreover, as Corridor's petition for reconsideration is based on a modified proposal for DTV Channel 8 which Corridor first proposed on October 2, 2007, subsequent to the release on August 6, 2007 of the Seventh Report and Order, such petition for reconsideration should be summarily denied pursuant to Section 1.429 (b) of the rules.


