Dear Ms. Dortch,

On November 7, 2007, Wayne Watts, Ralph de la Vega, and Robert Quinn, representing AT&T, met with Commissioner Jonathan Adelstein and his Legal Advisors Renee Crittendon and Scott Bergmann. At the meeting, AT&T reiterated the public interest benefits of the proposed license transfers, as described in the application filed in the above-referenced proceeding and as further discussed in Applicants' joint opposition. The parties stressed the importance of expedited action to ensure that the benefits of the transaction can accrue promptly to Dobson's subscribers and employees. AT&T also requested prompt resolution so AT&T can position itself to fully meet the demands of the Holiday retail season in Dobson's territories. AT&T also discussed its proposed rural broadband and mobility pilot programs and issues regarding stabilizing Universal Service Fund growth to allow for comprehensive reform. Our comments were consistent with positions contained in previous filings in the above referenced docket.
