**MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE SUPPLEMENT
TO PETITION FOR PARTIAL RECONSIDERATION OF
HAWAII PUBLIC TELEVISION FOUNDATION**

Hawaii Public Television Foundation (“HPTF”), licensee of noncommercial educational stations KHET-DT (Honolulu, Hawaii) and KMEB-DT (Wailuku, Hawaii), by its attorneys, hereby submits this Motion for Leave to File Supplement to Petition for Partial Reconsideration (“Motion”). HPTF is submitting the Supplement to Petition for Partial Reconsideration (“Supplement”) concurrently with this Motion.¹

Consideration of the Supplement would serve the public interest because it would permit the Commission to address on the basis of a complete and full record the allotment revision requested in the timely filed Petition for Partial Reconsideration (“Petition”).² In the October 26, 2007 Petition, HPTF requested that the allotment for KHET-DT reflect an appropriate Antenna ID. HPTF also requested that the KMEB-DT allotment match the parameters of a new site

HPTF must use after being forced from its current tower.³ That petition noted “HPTF will quickly supplement” the KHET-DT petition,⁴ and “HPTF will supplement this [KMEB-DT] petition as quickly as possible.”⁵ After reviewing the technical information with its consulting engineer, HPTF confirmed that the parameters requested in the October 26, 2007 Petition will not cause KHET-DT or KMEB-DT to exceed the Commission’s 0.1% interference threshold towards affected stations. In these discussions, HPTF also found that due to tower space concerns, the proposed new post-transition antenna for KHET-DT must operate at a lower HAAT while still maintaining the KHET-DT populated coverage area.

For these reasons, HPTF requests that the Commission accept and consider its Supplement.
