GW Wireless, Inc. (“GWW”) is the licensee of Station WPOJ757 (E-Block – Mitchell, South Dakota BTA) and Station WPOJ758 (C-Block – Rapid City, South Dakota BTA) in the broadband Personal Communications Service. This report is submitted pursuant to the requirements of Paragraph Nos. 89 – 91 of the Commission’s *Report and Order* (WT Docket No. 01-309), FCC 03-168, released August 14, 2003 (“R&O”).

By way of background, GWW is a small, Tier III Commercial Mobile Radio Service licensee, as defined in the Commission’s E-911 *Order to Stay*, FCC 02-210, released July 26, 2002. The company has configured its broadband PCS system in Rapid City to provide a fixed, data-only service using an Airspan AS4000 wireless DSL platform. The Mitchell BTA system is under construction in phases, in accordance with the Commission’s grant of a waiver request. *See Order*, In the Matter of GW Wireless, DA 07-323 (*rel.* January 30, 2007). Because GWW currently offers two or fewer digital wireless handsets in the U.S., it qualifies for the *de minimis* exception to the Hearing Aid Compatibility (“HAC”) rules, described in Rule Section 20.19 (e)(1).
