Notice of Oral *Ex Parte* Presentation

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On November 11, 2007, Andrew Jay Schwartzman of Media Access Project and Angela Campbell of the Institute for Public Representation participated in a three-way telephone call with Rudy Brioché, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Adelstein.

During the conversation, Mr. Schwartzman expressed strong opposition to any Commission decision which would permit cross-ownership of a newspaper and two or more broadcast properties in a community. Professor Campbell urged closing of the "footnote 25" loophole which permits licensees to acquire newspapers and hold them for up to eight years before receiving Commission scrutiny.

With respect to the Commission's localism docket, Mr. Schwartzman emphasized that improved procedural protections are needed for transfers and assignments as well as renewals.

The participants also discussed minority ownership. Mr. Schwartzman opposed use of the SBA's definition of small and disadvantaged businesses and indicated that he preferred a consideration of a "full file review" option.
