The Board Members protesting on this wrong news said that the Club has nothing to do with the Pakistan Embassy. The Baloch Club is a club of Pakistani citizens who belong from Balochistan. The newspaper in same day newspaper clarified that this mistake was for some mix up. The Balochis love Pakistan. The item for deep thinking in this is how the Pakistani people dislike their Embassies abroad. They rightly dislike. Another daily newspaper Bahrain Tribunes published weekly a Pakistani community page. Last year it captioned there was a big wedge between Pakistani Embassy and Pakistani community. The photograph also mentioned the Ambassador introduced to the Minister a Mr. R who will after the Ambassador remain in touch with the Minister. Mr. R who is a private company Engineer. If he is to keep meeting the Minister then why Pakistan has a big Embassy with Councilors, Secretaries, Welfare Attaches. Mr. R is a person

whom the community knows only from one thing that he is never seen in general community gatherings and since many years still is to pay the cash to organizers of an Islamic charity whose tickets he sold. Mr. R says tickets were lost by him. The last month I was having my food from a small hotel of a Pakistani. The non educated owner was also sitting with me. Earlier he was a porter in a company. As he is a social worker few years ago he spoke rightly in favour of another labourer. The Embassy got this social worker removed from his employment and sent to jail for deportation. By chance one day before he was to put in plane the Ansar Barni advocate came to Bahrain. On knowing it he acted promptly with help of Pakistan Club and saved this man. For his un due suffering God gave him Bahraini nationality which he had never before thought. Today that porter is today a businessman and owns the said hotel. While I was eating he was remembering old days and blessing of God. In the

world Pakistani Embassies are the only who so often get the Pakistanis removed from service in foreign countries. It should be a point how people do not like their names even with embassy people even with a lunch.
