In response to your December 12, 2007 letter requesting additional information for the 700 MHz relocation for the City of Mesa's 700 MHz Public Safety communications system:

Item 2

Call Sign WPTZ765 (State of Arizona license) – Location 1 Base station/ repeater stations are located on top of Thompson Peak, Maricopa County, Arizona (see coordinates in Item 4 below). Mobile units operate in a 32 km radius around Location 1.

Call Sign WQDV725 (City of Mesa license) – Location 1 is a Station Class MOI statewide license. Area of operation includes the City of Mesa, the Town of Gilbert, the City of Apache Junction, Apache Junction Fire District and portions of Northeastern Maricopa County and Northern Pinal County.

Item 4

Call Sign WPTZ765 base stations are located on Thompson Peak, Maricopa County, Arizona, approximately 16 km North of Mesa. Latitude 33-38-39.2 N, Longitude 111-48-43.5 W, site elevation 1222.2 meters (649.6 m AAT)

Call Sign WQDV725 is used for short-range unit to unit public safety event operations within the jurisdictional boundaries of the City of Mesa and surrounding communities. There are no base stations associated with these frequencies.
