**Supplement to Petition for Reconsideration  
of the Seventh Report and Order  
of Corridor Television LLP  
Licensee of KCWX, Fredericksburg, Texas**

Corridor Television LLP ("Corridor"), licensee of television station KCWX, analog Channel 2, Facility Id. 24316, Fredericksburg, Texas, through its undersigned counsel and pursuant to Section 1.106 of the Commission's Rules, hereby files this supplement to its petition for reconsideration of the *Seventh Report and Order and Eighth Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking In the Matter of Advanced Television Systems and their Impact Upon the Existing Television Broadcast Service*, MB Docket No. 87-268, FCC 07-138, 22 FCC Rcd 15581, 42 CR 1, released Aug. 6, 2007 ("the *Seventh Report and Order*").

The *Seventh Report and Order* denied the request of Corridor for a change in its TCD to Channel 8 on two grounds, that Corridor would cause more than 0.5 percent interference to KTBC, an adjacent channel station, and that the 0.5 percent interference standard was only a proposal and had not been adopted:

We note that the 0.5 percent standard is only a proposal and a different standard could be adopted. Moreover, the new interference caused to KTBC, 0.79 percent, not only significantly exceeds the current 0.1 percent interference standard applied to channel substitution requests, it also exceeds even the proposed 0.5 percent standard.<sup>1</sup>

Corridor responded to the Commission's decision by amending its proposal to request Channel 8 with facilities that would cause no more than 0.5 percent interference to KTBC. Corridor also made clear that such facilities would not commence operation until the 0.5 percent standard is in effect.

Subsequently, on December 31, 2007, the FCC adopted the 0.5 percent interference standard:

Therefore, to provide an opportunity for at least modest modifications, we will allow stations to cause up to 0.5 percent new interference, in addition to interference reflected in the DTV Table Appendix B. Applying 0.5 percent to this baseline of existing interference will provide the flexibility and expansion sought by commenters that suggested allowing higher interference levels. It would also effectively control the amount of new interference that could be experienced by any one station. We find this approach provides a reasonable balance between having sufficient flexibility to expand and modify facilities while preventing substantial disruption for viewers due to interference between stations. We therefore adopt the 0.5 percent interference standard and will apply it using the DTV Table Appendix B facilities as a baseline.<sup>2</sup>

The amendment of the Corridor proposal and the adoption of the 0.5 percent interference standard constitute changes in circumstances that warrant reconsideration of the denial of Corridor's request for Channel 8.

Corridor originally requested Channel 8 as its DTV channel. The Commission Staff indicated that Corridor could be assigned Channel 8 with a power limit that would comply with the 0.1 percent interference standard. At this time, Corridor is requesting Channel 8 with a power limit that complies with the 0.5 percent interference standard. As the 0.5 percent interference standard has been adopted, Corridor's request should be granted at this time.

In order to facilitate the timely conversion of KCWX from operation as an analog singleton on Channel 2 to operation as a digital station in time to meet the transition deadline, the Commission should assign Channel 8 to KCWX so that KCWX can file a construction permit application within 45 days after the *Third Report and Order* is published in the Federal Register.

Wherefore, for the foregoing reasons, Corridor respectfully requests that the Commission reconsider the *Seventh Report and Order* only to the limited extent requested herein and change the TCD of KCWX, Fredericksburg, Texas to Channel 8 with 15 kW non-directional ERP at 413 meters HAAT.
