REQUEST FOR REVIEW

CC: 02-6

Pursuant to Section 54.719(c) of the Rules of the Federal Communication Commission (“FCC” or “Commission”), Bryan City School District, Bryan, Ohio (“Bryan”), respectfully requests review of the November 27, 2007 Funding Commitment Decision Letter (“FCDL”) (attached as Exhibit A) of the Schools and Libraries Division (“SLD”) of the Universal Service Administrative Company (“USAC”) that denied funding for FCC Form 470 #405930000592631 (“Form 470,” attached as Exhibit B) and associated Form 471 #555220 (“Form 471,” attached as Exhibit C) and Funding Request Number (“FRN”) 1531837 for Funding Year 2007 (07/01/2007 – 06/30/2008). As will be shown below, the SLD: (1) without consent and in violation of the FCC’s rules and regulations removed funding from the request as a Request for Basic Maintenance of Internal Connections; (2) incorrectly determined that the request was for Basic Maintenance of Internal Connections; and then (3) denied funding because less than 30% of the FRN was a request for Basic Maintenance of Internal Connections.

On December 05, 2006 Bryan posted its Form 470 requesting: at line 8 Telecommunication Services; at line 9 Internet Access; at line 10 Internal Connections other than Basic Maintenance; and at line 11 Basic Maintenance of Internal Connections. On January 02, 2007 Bryan entered into a contract for Internet Access with the Northern Buckeye Education Counsel (“NWOCA”). This contract was assigned the Funding Request Number (“FRN”) 1531837 and was for an annual pre-discount amount for eligible non-recurring charges of \$64,415.80. The same Form 471 showed funding requests for Telecommunications Services (FRN # 1543923); Telecommunication Services (FRN # 1543968); and Telecommunications Service (FRN # 1544024). (The Form 471 showed no contracts or funding requests for either the Form 470 item 10 nor item 11 requests, and no contracts for those requested services were ever entered into.)

There then followed a series of missteps and erroneous determinations by the SLD, possibly stemming, in part, from the applicant’s use of a term of art “Internal Connections” when it was describing on-premise equipment used with Internet Access, but unaware that the same term “Internal Connections” is defined differently by the Commission. Nonetheless, based on the unambiguous record before it, the SLD should not have removed any funding for the request as “Maintenance of Internal Connections” and should not have denied Bryan’s FRN 1531837.

Attachment 21 to FRN 1531837 is attached as Exhibit D, hereto. It described the Internet Service requested as follows (emphasis added):

Narrative Description: Basic Conduit Internet Access including DNS, Internet Content-Filtering, and Firewall Services with Gigabit Ethernet Transport and T-1 ATM Transport; 6Mb/s Internet Bandwidth (burstable at no additional charge to 30Mb/s; bursting beyond 30Mb/s available at \$1,000/year per 10Mb/s beyond 30Mb/s); including the following additional bundled services:

- Unlimited basic SMTP Email accounts (limited to district students and staff);

with bundled SPAM filtering

- Unlimited web hosting accounts (Frontpage) for school district and teacher websites and sub-webs with a total storage capacity of 2GB per district. Additional disk storage \$5/GB/month
- Network Connectivity Technical Support for Internet Connections
- Equipment Maintenance and Technical Support of the Equipment Required to Provide Internet Connections
- Interconnected Voice Over Internet Protocol Service for Entities Utilizing a CiscoVOIP solution including Voicemail Services and Components
- **Maintenance and Technical Support of Internal Connections, and the Equipment Required to Provide this Cisco VOIP Telephony Functionality**

All of the requested services were clearly eligible services to be provided by an Internet Service Provider like NWOCA, except for the last bulleted item. While the last bullet states that it covers: “Maintenance and Technical Support of **Internal Connections**, and the Equipment Required to Provide this Cisco VOIP Telephony Functionality,” the intent of the last bullet is clearly to describe the maintenance of the VOIP functionality using the Cisco equipment. The described functionality is part of Internet Access and is not “Internal Connections” as defined in the *Tennessee Order*.¹ Bryan repeatedly tried to point this out to the SLD with little effect.

On February 9, 2007, Bryan received a Receipt Acknowledgement Letter (“RAL”) which incorrectly showed a value of \$67,035.80 for line 23(g) (“Ineligible Non-Recurring Amount”) (Exhibit E). In point of fact, the correct value for line 23(g) as reflected on the Form 471 was only \$2,620.00. **Even so, line 11 of page 4 of Exhibit E, which contained the request at issue here, clearly specified the category of service as “Internet Access.”** Before Bryan could even respond, it received a letter from USAC dated February 14, 2007 (Exhibit F) which asked for, *inter alia*, a supplement to the Item 21 Attachment within 15 calendar days. Bryan submitted a timely response on February 16, 2007 (Exhibit G) which provided more detailed documentation

identifying (a) the actual products and services being requested and delivered and (b) ineligible charges that were cost allocated out of the request. Then on February 20, 2007, a new RAN (Exhibit H) was issued which corrected the line 23 (g) error – **and which again properly characterized the request in issue here as “Internet Access.”**

On July 26, 2007, a Funding Commitment Decision Letter (“FCDL”) (Exhibit I) was issued which categorized the \$64,415.80 requested in FRN 1531837 as “Basic Maintenance of Internal Connections.” This determination was clearly inconsistent with both the February 9 and February 20, 2007 RANs. Nor was it consistent with the information before the SLD, had the SLD conducted even a minimal analysis of the information before it. On August 1, 2007, Bryan appealed the July 26, 2007 FCDL to the SLD with support that showed that there had been no request for internal connections, but only a request for internet access (Exhibit J). On the cover sheet to the August 1, 2007 appeal Bryan stated that it made an error on the Form 471 by erroneously stating the wrong category of service as “Basic Maintenance of Internal Connections.” In point of fact, Bryan correctly showed the service as Internet Access as had been reflected on both the February 2 and 20 RANs.

On August 24, 2007, in response to Bryan’s appeal, the SLD, for the first time, undertook the type of investigation and analysis required by *Bishop Perry Middle School* (FCC 06-54, released May 19, 2006) and *Henkels & McCoy Inc.* (DA 06-1463, released July 19, 2006). As required by these decisions, when the SLD is confronted with procedural issues or questions regarding the eligibility of services, the FCC has directed the SLD not to reject outright an application for E-rate discounts but to “conduct a more detailed inquiry to determine whether the

products or services were eligible.’² In an August 24, 2007 email (part of Exhibit K), Gary Herbst of SLD asked Tim Rettig of Bryan for more detailed information concerning FRN 1531837. Bryan submitted a detailed response on September 19, 2007 (also part of Exhibit K). On October 2, 2007, Molly Brummer of SLD asked Mr. Rettig for additional information to supplement Bryan’s earlier response (Exhibit L). On October 10, 2007, Bryan submitted a detailed timely response to the October 2, 2007, inquiry (Exhibit M).

According to our records there was no further communication from the SLD until November 27, 2007, when an FCDL was issued (Exhibit A) which: (i) reduced the pre-discount amount for eligible charges from \$64,415.80 to \$52,483.80 with no justification; asserted that those funds had been removed from the FRN at Bryan’s request; found that less than 30% of the FRN was a request for Basic Maintenance of Internal Connections; and then denied the entire request because the funding level for Internal Connections had been exceeded. The SLD’s determinations are without justification and inconsistent with the record before it, as outlined above.

There was no justification for the SLD to arbitrarily reduce the pre-discounted amount from \$64,415.80 to \$52,483.80. Absent compelling justification, the SLD cannot reduce the pre-discounted amount. Far from there being any compelling justification, no justification whatsoever has been provided. The pre-discounted amount should be reinstated to \$64, 415.80.

The applicant never requested that funds be removed from the FRN in question. Rather, it merely clarified that it had used incorrect terminology to describe one element of its request.

Even so, the SLD clearly understood the true nature of this element, as it had twice categorized it properly in both NALs.

Bryan provided detailed explanation and back-up to support its assertion that it was requesting Internet Access and not Internal Connections. As can be seen from the attached Exhibits, Bryan showed that the system design is almost exactly like the system design permitted by the Federal Communications Commission in its *Tennessee Order*, *supra*, at ¶¶ 37-38.

- NWOCA provides a seamless Internet service to several demarcation points in the building, just as was permitted in ¶ 30 of the *Tennessee Order*.
- The on-premises equipment in the schools will function if NWOCA's system fails. The NWOCA system can fail at any point up to and including the demarcation point for its service and the schools' internal network will continue to function. The router used by the system is not the demarcation point.
- The equipment used by NWOCA is an integral component of NWOCA's Internet Access service.
- All of the on-premise equipment will be provided by NWOCA.
- NWOCA will have the responsibility for maintaining the equipment.
- The ownership of the equipment will never transfer to the school.
- There is no option for the Bryan to purchase the equipment.
- The equipment will be used for Internet Access only.
- There are no contractual, technical or other limitations between Bryan and NWOCA that would prevent the equipment from being used or shared with other customers.

If the SLD had conducted a reasoned examination and analysis of the information before it, it would have found that the services requested by Bryan were permitted Priority One Services. Although the SLD conducted a perfunctory review, it totally disregarded the responses it received and failed to conduct the minimum analysis required by the FCC. The SLD, absent any finding of waste, fraud or abuse consistent with 47 C.F.R. § 54.702(g), failed to conduct the

required inquiry and overstepped its authority by changing the service category on FRN 1531837, and thereby resulted in the denial of funding.

The SLD has also misapplied the FCC's 30% rule. Section 54.504(d) of the Commission's rules provides with respect to mixed eligibility requests: "If 30 percent or more of a request for discounts made in an FCC Form 471 is for ineligible services, the request shall be denied in its entirety." Even so, in *Aiken County Public Schools*, 22 FCC Rcd 8735 (May 8, 2007), the full Commission tempered the impact of the rule. There, it granted 59 appeals of USAC denials of e-rate funding requests on the ground that some had provided sufficient evidence to demonstrate that at least 70% of the requested services were eligible for support, and went on to waive the rule on its own motion to permit the others to remove ineligible services from their funding requests. The Commission further directed USAC, beginning in FY 2007, once it finds that an applicant has requested funding for an ineligible service, to afford a 15-day opportunity to amend the application to eliminate ineligible services or to provide additional documentation to justify the requested services. In the instant case the SLD found that **less than** 30% was ineligible as a Priority II Service. Pursuant to Section 54.504(d) of the Rules, the 30% ineligible threshold was not crossed, so therefore the 30% rule did not even apply. Moreover, even if **more than** 30% was properly found to be ineligible, the SLD failed to meet its obligations under *Aiken County Public Schools, supra*.

Denial of funding in this case would be inconsistent with the statutory goal of the E-rate program mandated by Congress of preserving and advancing universal service among schools and libraries most in need of support.³ Admittedly, Bryan inadvertently misused the term

“Internal Connections” when it meant on-premises equipment used as part of Internet Access, but denial of the entire funding request without the further inquiry required under *Bishop Perry* and *Henkels & McCoy* was impermissibly harsh and inconsistent with the program’s statutory goal.

Conclusion


It was error for the SLD to deny funding to FRN 1531837 because: (1) Bryan did not authorize the reduction of the pre-discount amount; (2) Bryan provided sufficient support for the SLD to find that its requested service was a Priority One service permitted under the *Tennessee Order*; (3) Bryan provided, in a timely manner, all information requested by the SLD; (4) there is no factual or legal basis for the SLD’s change of category of service from Internet Access to Internal Connections and (5) the 30% Rule was inappropriately applied.

Therefore, Bryan respectfully requests that the Commission grant this Request for Review, remand the FCDL, find that the SLD erred in its decision to deny funding, and direct the SLD to approve funding for FRN 1531837.
