

Referencing WC Docket no. 07-52

I've seriously been affected by Comcast interjecting denial of service attacks in my broadband connection.

I use Linux (Ubuntu) and it uses P2P BitTorrent technology to update the operating system with new releases and security fixes.

For five days, I was unable to upgrade my computer after an update was released. I spent well over 30 hours trouble shooting the problem. Only to find out Comcast is interjecting a denial of service attack via (RST) packets into my data stream.

Under normal circumstances, this is illegal. In other words, if I were to do this to someone else's connection I would be facing felony charges.

I'm incredulous you're even discussing this with Comcast outside the courtroom. You're not serving the public by condoning felonious actions by even holding a hearing. You should be filing criminal charges. A DOS (Denial Of Service) attack is illegal. Your rules, not mine.

It's difficult to have trust in the FCC serving the public interest when you condone illegal actions by the entities you're supposed to be monitoring.
