On January 30, 2008, the undersigned and Peter Corea, Senior Regulatory Counsel for ICO Global Communications (“ICO”) met with Ira Keltz, Deputy Chief of the Office of Engineering and Technology (OET); Geraldine Matisse, Chief, OET Policy and Rules Division; Jamison Prime, Spectrum Policy Branch Chief, OET; Nicholas Oros, OET; and David Furth, Associate Bureau Chief of the Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau. ICO discussed the comments it filed on December 19, 2007 addressing the “Consensus Plan” of Sprint Nextel Corporation, the Association For Maximum Service Television, Inc. (MSTV), the National Association of Broadcasters (NAB), and the Society of Broadcast Engineers (SBE), filed in the above-referenced proceedings on December 6, 2007.

ICO also discussed the imminent launch of the ICO G1 satellite and ICO’s ability to meet operational milestones. In addition, ICO discussed its ability to enter into mobile satellite service (“MSS”) operations on a trial basis in 2008 and on a nationwide basis in

2009. Further, ICO addressed the need for regulatory certainty in connection with the clearing of the broadcast auxiliary and other services (“BAS”) from the 2000-2020 MHz band, and the implications of additional delay to 2 GHz MSS.
