Dear Ms. Dortch:

On January 30, 2008, representative of Comcast, Time Warner, CableLabs and Microsoft met with various members of the Commission and Commission staff to present a technical demonstration involving tru2way (also known as "OpenCable Platform") technology and potential future versions of Windows Media Center personal computers. At these meetings, Mark Vickers, Jim Poder, Mark Coblitz, and James Coltharp represented Comcast; Paul Mitchell, Martin Sacchi and Paula Boyd represented Microsoft; Judy Cary represented Cable Labs; and Timothy Dodd and the undersigned represented Time Warner Cable.

These above-referenced representatives met with the following Commissioner personnel: Amy Blankenship, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Deborah Tate; Commissioner Jonathan Adelstein and his legal advisor Rudy Brioche; Rick Chessen, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Michael Copps; and Commissioner Robert McDowell and members of his staff including legal advisor Cristina Pauze, Brigid Calamis, Mary Underwood and Brian Scarpelli; and members of the Media Bureau, including Monica Desai, Mary Beth Murphy, Brendan Murray, Steve Broeckaert, Jeffrey Neumann, John Gabrysch, Mike Lance, John Kiefer, Wayne McKee, John Wong, Jane Frenette and Dana Schereer.

During these presentations, we explained that representatives of the cable industry are working with Microsoft and certain other technology providers with the objective of enabling third party personal computing, home networking and portable devices to securely access, network, and record, compliant with applicable encoding rules, interactive cable content. The demonstration showed cable interactive tru2way guides and premium services provided by Comcast and Time Warner Cable running on a developmental version of Windows provided by Microsoft. This technical demonstration included presentation of premium cable content delivered over a home network to the Xbox 360 platform using Media Center Extender technology, and the ordering and displaying of interactive "Video On Demand" content to personal computers via the cable operator's guide and video on demand applications.
