
Dear Ms. Dortch:

On January 31, 2008, William Wallace and the undersigned, representing Verizon Wireless, met with Wayne Leighton and Chris Moore of Commissioner Tate's Staff. At Mr. Leighton's request, we first explained the status of the pending applications for transfer of control of wireless licenses and other authorizations held by Rural Cellular Corporation to Verizon Wireless (WT Docket 07-208), and urged that the Commission act expeditiously in this proceeding.

Second, we discussed the development and use of "common short codes" for delivery of mobile content to wireless subscribers. We explained the process for obtaining a common short code and activating the associated campaign on a wireless carrier's network. We discussed the guidelines for subscribers to participate in short code campaigns, and for content distribution, that the mobile content industry and wireless carriers have developed. Finally, we discussed the implications of the requests in the pending Petition for Declaratory Ruling (WT Docket 08-7) for distribution of content through such common short code campaigns, including harms to subscribers.

Pursuant to Section 1.1206(b)(2) of the Commission's Rules, a copy of this letter is being filed in each of the above-referenced dockets through the Electronic Comment Filing System.
