Dear Ms. Dortch,

This letter is to advise you, in accordance with Section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules, that on February 6, 2008, Marvin Ammori and Ben Scott of Free Press met with Chairman Kevin Martin, his Chief of Staff Daniel Gonzalez, and Catherine Bohigian, Chief of the Office of Strategic Planning & Policy Analysis, at the offices of the Federal Communications Commission.

We discussed the Petition for Declaratory Ruling filed by Free Press et al. and Complaint against Comcast filed by Free Press and Public Knowledge, both filed Nov. 1, 2007. We discussed our Petition and urged the Commission to gather as much information as possible about these issues. We stressed that the issue pertains both to open Internet issues and to video competition, as all devices and services continue to converge. We again urged the Commission to act promptly and urged the Commission to at least require complete public disclosure of network management policies as an immediate interim measure, as it acts on the Petition and Complaint, so that consumers and the Commission can best understand the facts and the effects on consumers.
