On February 7, 2008, Caressa D. Bennet and David Fritz of Bennet & Bennet, PLLC, General Counsel for the Rural Telecommunications Group, Inc. (“RTG”); Joseph M. Sandri, Jr., Senior Vice President of Government and Regulatory Affairs for FiberTower Corporation (“FiberTower”); Richard B. Engelman, Director, Spectrum Resources, Government Affairs for Sprint Nextel Corporation (“Sprint Nextel”), and Trey Hanbury, Director, Government Regulation for Sprint Nextel; Patrick T. Welsh, Senior Corporate Counsel, Federal Regulatory Affairs for T-Mobile USA, Inc. (“T-Mobile”); and Michele C.
