Dear Ms. Dortch:

On February 26, 2008, the undersigned (“Ms. Desai”) of Media Access Project, Pete Tridish (“Mr. Tridish”), Sakura Saunders (“Ms. Saunders”), and Kate Blofson of Prometheus Radio Project, Marcos Urbina and Luz Martinez of the Mexican Cultural Association, Beth McConnell of the Media and Democracy Coalition, Matt Murphy of WERU-FM Community Radio, Tom Roe and Dharma Dailey of Free103point9, Nivo Leone of KDHX, St. Louis, Jim Price of WBFC-LP, Boynton-Ringgold, Scott Sanders WRFN-LP Radio Free Nashville, Michelle Eyre of REC Networks, Al Davis of Flint Acorn, Jennifer Uzak and Shawn Campbell (“Mr. Campbell”) of Chicago Independent Radio Project, and Alex Allen of WFTE Scanton met with Peter Doyle, Division Chief, Audio Division, James Bradshaw, Deputy Division Chief, Audio Division and Kelly Donohue of the Media Bureau at the offices of the Federal Communications Commission. At this meeting the parties discussed some of the issues raised in the LPFM proceedings.

Those parties present representing community broadcasters briefly discussed their experiences in local radio. The parties expressed support for the proposed second-adjacent LPFM waiver standards. These standards protect LPFM stations from being displaced by full-power stations such as those represented at the meeting.

The parties discussed the preclusive effect of translators on LPFMs. Ms. Saunders discussed problems with abuse of the translator service and encouraged those present to take action to ensure no further abuse occurred. Mr. Campbell suggested that LPFMs should be prioritized over translators that don’t provide local programming.
