Dear Ms. Dortch:

On March 20, 2008, Andrew Jay Schwartzman, President, Media Access Project and Harold Feld, Senior Vice President, Media Access Project, met with Chairman Martin and his advisers Michelle Carey and Ian Dillner with regard to the above captioned matter. Mr. Feld and Mr. Schwartzman observed that recent statements by social conservatives that Comcast's conduct bears on protecting children from indecent content have no basis in the facts of Comcast's conduct. Comcast blocked the upload of the King James Bible, which all would agree is not indecent and which many social conservatives would agree should be disseminated as broadly as possible. In addition, Comcast's apparent attempt to represent itself as protecting children from indecent content is belied by Comcast's devoting significant cable capacity to indecent material, easily available to minors, and by requiring parents to purchase channels with potentially indecent content bundled with channels providing children's content.

In accordance with Section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. §1.1206, this letter is being filed with your office.
