

FCC: This procedure seeking comments, 08-27, is procedurally flawed from the outset because FCC refuses to admit that the ECFS email system is still systematically destroying comments, unread. Until ECFS is fixed, no actions of FCC utilizing ECFS are valid.

FCC has known of the flaws in ECFS since at least November 2005. At that time I informed Hanson and Cline in the FCC computer section that ECFS was deleting comments. In 2007 FCC was formally and clearly made aware of the ECFS defects via the Petition for Reconsideration discussed in Paragraph 7 of MOO 08-59 . FCC chose to ignore those ECFS flaws but did not deny that ECFS had comment deletion flaws.

Since 2005 the ECFS instructions have been notably improved. In addition, some of the defects of ECFS comment deletion have been corrected.

ECFS is still deleting the comments, unread, of a subset of comments submitted via ECFS .

Any FCC pretense of validity is just that, a
pretense, until FCC fixes the flawed ECFS.
