
Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Thursday, March 27, 2008, David Donovan, President of the Association for Maximum Service Television Bruce Franca, Vice President for Policy & Technology, and its undersigned counsel met with Chairman Kevin Martin and Aaron Goldberger, his legal advisor, with respect to the white spaces docket.

Mr. Franca, who has spent much of the past two months observing the tests of unlicensed devices being conducted by the FCC's Labs, reported on the test results so far. Those evaluations are summarized in the attached chart. He also pointed out the importance of testing these devices in the lab with an antenna and in situations that reflect how consumers will use the devices.

There was brief discussion of the Google and CTIA filings and of the possibility of a fuller consideration of alternative uses of the white spaces. We mentioned that mobile video testing in connection with unlicensed devices could begin in the relatively near future after completion of the testing of mobile video technologies being undertaken on behalf of the Advanced Television Systems Committee and the Open Mobile Video Coalition.
