This is to notify you that on April 1, 2008, Chester C. Davenport, Founder and Managing Director of Georgetown Partners L.L.C., Rev. Jesse L. Jackson, Sr., Founder and President, Rainbow PUSH Coalition and Kimberly Marcus, Rainbow PUSH Coalition, met with Commissioner Adelstein, Commissioner Copps, Rudy Brioché, Rick Chessen and Scott Deutchman.

Georgetown's discussion was consistent with its filings previously submitted in this docket. Georgetown also discussed the March 24th decision of the Assistant Attorney General for Antitrust, stating that the decision is contrary to years of well-established law in the antitrust area, as well as sound public and economic policies. Georgetown further stated that his decision rewards Sirius and XM for their failure to honor the commitment they made to the Commission to develop and market an interoperable radio capable of receiving both Sirius and XM DARS signals. The public interest requires that a viable competitor be established in the market if the Commission decides to approve the merger. Georgetown Partners is prepared to provide that competition, as well as satisfy the need for diversity.

In accordance with Section 1.1206 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206, this letter is being filed in the above docket.
