

On Monday, April 21, 2008, Edward A. Yorkgitis, Jr. and Brad Mutschelknaus of Kelley Drye & Warren LLP, representing Covad Communications Company, NuVox Communications, Inc., and XO Communications LLC, along with Kelly Faul, Director, Regulatory Affairs of XO; Karen Reidy, Vice President, Regulatory Affairs, CompTel; Amy Wolverton, Senior Corporate Counsel, Federal Regulatory Affairs, T-Mobile; and Maria Cattafesta, Director, Government Affairs, Sprint/Nextel Corp., met with Chris Moore of Commissioner Tate's office.
