Dear Ms. Dortch:

On April 22, 2008, Christopher Guttman-McCabe, Vice President, Regulatory Affairs, Paul Garnett, Assistant Vice President, Regulatory Affairs, Brian Josef, Director, Regulatory Affairs, and David Redl, Counsel, Regulatory Affairs, CTIA – The Wireless Association® held a teleconference with Angela Giancarlo, Chief of Staff and Senior Legal Advisor to Commissioner Robert McDowell to discuss CTIA’s continued support for the dismissal of the Skype Petition.

In light of the high level of competition between mobile wireless service offerings and the dynamic and competitive nature of the industry, CTIA opposes one-size-fits-all regulation of the wireless marketplace. Even the most well intentioned regulation will quickly be overtaken by technological changes and will hinder the ability of wireless carriers to react to consumer demands. Wireless carriers, reacting to the demands of consumers in the competitive market, have already taken steps to expand consumer access to new and innovative wireless devices. Additionally, even in the absence of action by wireless carriers to address consumer demands, the Commission’s “open platform” requirement on the 700 MHz C block guarantees a portion of this valuable spectrum will be open to new and innovative devices and applications. Because both Commission action and the wireless marketplace have addressed the concerns raised by Skype, the Petition should be dismissed.
