

Addenda to last-filed comments I made, for clarification.

Docket 04-233, Broadcast localism docket.

Forgot to define exactly who I referred to as a statewide network, etc.

1. Statewide Network. A statewide network is a group of usually FM or TV stations who have NCE-FM licenses or permits in the reserved band of the FM spectrum or reserved TV channels and occasionally nonreserved frequencies in either band, plus owns translators for either FM or TV depending on what is needed to rebroadcast the signals, within a state or localized region that encompasses a common localized area for the purposes of providing broadcast service for that area. This includes any community based group that needs several stations to cover a listener base, usually in one or two markets, occasionally more where those are very close and the markets being tied together economically and socially to the educational institution or local community organization that may be sponsoring the station.

2. National network. An entity, often not associated with a local educational institution or local community organization and which may have a large number of authorizations, frequently running over 100 and occasionally several hundred stations and authorizations, that often rebroadcasts the exact same content without any local content such as news, weather, traffic, local PSAs, weather warnings, etc., to the entire group of listed authorizations that are on the air, or who intend to do the same regarding authorizations that may be either new permits or under construction, once they are able to commence program test authority, or which they may purchase for that purpose.

This description of those two categories may be used in reference to all cited references to these two groups in all previous comments I have made and the Commission has accepted for filing in Docket 04-233, especially the comments logged as having been filed on or within the few days prior to, April 28th 2008.
