Dear Mr. Herling:

Thank you for your prompt response to my letter of August 21, 2006. I look forward to working with KXLY during the next few months of the campaign.

You mention in your letter an interest in working to develop a television and radio debate on KXLY stations. Since the primary election is so late in the campaign cycle, and ballots go to voters hands just a few weeks after the primary, the general election discussion time is unusually short this year. We have scheduled a televised debate to air on KREM and KSPS television about October 22.

I'm writing to explore with you the possibility of arranging some substantive discussion of crucial issues in the Fifth Congressional District perhaps sometime in late September. Since another station is scheduling a debate, I'm wondering if it would be worth considering another format for discussion, such as a radio call-in question/answer program giving equal time for each candidate, if both cannot be in the studio at the same time. What about a TV Town Hall type discussion with both candidates taking questions from a selected studio audience?

I would suggest scheduling and getting commitments from the candidates as soon as possible since schedules are going to become incredibly tight. Thanks again for taking so seriously what your stations add to the public discourse of the election.
