What is being appealed?


The FCD Explanation: That this service category has been changed to Internal Connections (priority 2) in accordance with Program Rules. I would like to contest that ruling.

The "Internet Access" definition found on the Eligible Services List for Funding Year 2007 states: "Support in this funding category is only available for basic conduit access to the Internet or *for services that are an integral component part of basic conduit access.*"

Our running the Novell client on our workstations is what actually allows our students to get to the internet. Without this client (or something similar), we cannot invoke workstation policies for students and staff to 1) access the internet in a secure manner, and 2) enforce a filtering policy and be CIPA compliant.
