



I am Chief Planning Officer for El Centro Family Health, a federally and state funded community health center that serves mostly low income and uninsured patients in northern New Mexico.

We have frequently used the morning show "Over the Back Fence" to let people Las Vegas and surrounding areas about health programs or issues, and even fundraising events. 



WCRE Serves the Community

WCRE Radio serves Cheraw and surrounding communities 24 hours a day. We are the first place citizens turn to in times of need and / or severe circumstances.

We have 6 local newscasts each weekday. We break normal programming at any time when we need to inform the public.

"In September 2004, the after effects of Hurricane Jeanne spun off tornados in Cheraw including one that hit a wing of Cheraw Primary school. This was a very difficult time for Cheraw. No one was injured, but it was bad. WCRE Radio turned their microphone over to me. I was actually able to assure scared parents and direct traffic to the school so parents could pick up their children. We had to use alternative routing and I think every parent was tuned in to WCRE because no car diverted from my instructions."

"Any time there is bad winter weather, WCRE welcomes me to their studios to talk to the citizens. They even allow me to give phone reports to inform drivers about black ice on our roads. I am convinced this helps cut down on the number of car accidents."

"Just the other Saturday, Cheraw was under a tornado warning. The town sirens were activated. News Director Susan Gilmour and Jane Pigg were live on the radio telling folks what was going on and advising them to take cover. They stayed live until the warning expired. It's so comforting to me to know that my local radio station is concerned about the safety of our citizens day and night."



“Miracle on Stoneridge Street”

In 2007, WKTC-My 63 began searching for local charities and organizations that would benefit from extra exposure in the form of television airtime. While the station has always been involved in the community with groups such as the Palmetto Children’s Hospital, Sister Care, & Harvest Hope Food Bank, we felt these groups get a lot of exposure and we looked for something just as deserving, but possibly a little less known. We found that in the Volunteers of America’s Carolinas.

Volunteers of America is one of the oldest volunteer agencies in the country and has been in South Carolina for over 20 years, located on Stoneridge Street in downtown Columbia. The struggle they faced was that many people are not familiar with the services they provide, and in turn are often overlooked when it comes to charitable giving. While Volunteers of America helps out where they are needed the bulk of their resources go to three main areas:

- Children’s Garden - provides quality childcare for young children ages 6 weeks-5 years old. Clients include children and their families that are homeless, needy, in crisis, or lacking a support system.
- Willow Pond – provides shelter and counseling to homeless, single-parent families who have fled their homes due to domestic violence.
- Providing affordable housing to senior citizens and disabled adults.

With the variety of the services that Volunteers of America offers, WKTC-My63 felt they would be the ideal candidate with which to forge a long-term partnership and to educate the viewers of Columbia on what a great organization this is.

Throughout the year, WKTC-My 63 participated in several events with the Volunteers of America including providing backpacks and school supplies to Children’s Garden and sponsoring a joint team for the First Ladies Walk for Breast Cancer in October.

However, as the holidays began to approach we wanted to do everything we could to help the Volunteers of America provide a happy holiday season for all of the people they help throughout the year. We wanted to provide them a large platform with which to get their message out.

WKTC-My63 did something that had never been done before in this market. The station partnered with Volunteers of America and, through a sponsorship opportunity, Volunteers of America owned all the local advertising inventory in the My Network TV Movie "Miracle on 34th Street" – 18 minutes in total.

The station helped to produce specially created spots ranging from: 30-3:00 in length showcasing all the work that Volunteers of America do on a daily basis. It was the perfect opportunity to show Columbia what this truly deserving charity was all about.

It was a tremendous success! For weeks after the promotion, I heard from local advertisers and agency buyers that they had seen the Volunteers of America's promotion and thought it was a great idea and a great way to give back to the community. But the true success came the morning after "The Miracle on Stoneridge St" promotion when the city director called to say their phones were ringing off the hook. People were particularly touch by the Children's Garden spots and were bringing in toys and offering yearly sponsorships as a result.

When it comes to providing local news coverage and showing the importance of diversity in Fairbanks, no television company in Interior Alaska does more than Tanana Valley Television (TNTV).

The newscast produced by CBS News 13 (owned by TNTV) has a diverse staff, audience and content, which helps me, teach my students. They have also taken many interns from the University of Alaska Fairbanks (UAF) Journalism Department. The response from our interns is unanimous; we get to learn and do an awful lot of reporting while working at News 13.

The station has helped the UAF Journalism program grow by allowing use of their studio for classes and special projects. The station general manager, Chris Fry and owner Bill St Pierre have been incredibly supportive.

However, the newscast produced by Tanana Valley Television and assistance to the UAF Journalism Department (TNTV) is only half the story. The company also owns the local Fox affiliate in Fairbanks. TNTV approached the University of Alaska Fairbanks Office of Multicultural Affairs and Diversity about providing time on their program schedule for a show on diversity in Fairbanks and all of Alaska. With the assistance and encouragement of Mrs. Fry and Mr. St. Pierre the show, called Diversity Matters, is now on the air. The time slot is better than can we could have hoped for, 2:30 Saturday afternoon.

TNTV clearly works hard to assure its broadcast license needs are met as the station's audience sees diverse, local programming, not to mention providing excellent opportunities for UAF staff, faculty and students.
