Thank you for forwarding a letter that you received from several constituents in support of requiring any licensee of the 2155-2175 MHz band to provide free and family-friendly broadband service to at least 95% of the U.S. population.

The Commission recently released a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking seeking public comment on various proposals, including the ones that several of your constituents support, for wireless broadband use of the spectrum that is the subject of their letter. The Commission will consider all relevant information before deciding how to license the 2155-2175 MHz band.
