Thank you for forwarding the letter from Jesse Saunders, one of your constituents, in support of the application of M2Z Networks, Inc. (M2Z) for exclusive use of spectrum in the 2155-2175 MHz band.

The Commission recently released a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking seeking public comment on various proposals, including M2Z's, for wireless broadband use of the spectrum that is the subject of your letter. Comments are due December 14, 2007, and reply comments are due January 14, 2008. To provide the public with an opportunity to consider these proposals, the Commission also released an Order dismissing without prejudice all of the pending applications for that spectrum. A copy of your letter and this response will be placed in the rulemaking docket (WT Docket No. 07-195).


Dear Kevin:
